
Finance & Transparency

Send, drop off, or email the entry form to the addresses on the form before the closing time on 17th August.

Don't forget that you don't have to be an adult to enter the Flower and Produce Show but you do need to use the Flower and Produce Entry Form.

3. Stage

Bring along your exhibit(s) to the marquee between 8:30 and 10:30 on Show Day allowing yourself time to stage your produce or exhibit(s).

On arrival at the marquee register your name with the 'Meet and Greet' Team who will give you your entry no. to display on your exhibit(s).

Stewards will be on hand to help and give advice if needed.

Return later, after judging is completed, to enjoy the Show and see whether you have a prize card beside your exhibit(s).

Please collect your exhibits by 16:45, as produce remaining is then entered into the Produce Auction in the Bar.

- Harvest your entries as close to show day as possible for maximum freshness, except for garlic, onions
 or shallots; alliums need time for the skins to dry. Cucumbers do gain extra points if the flower is still
 attached.
- There's lots of advice online about 'staging', or presenting your vegetables, but don't forget that we use the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook. Check with Sue Ripley if you don't have a copy.

Hints and Tips from the judge for showing Flowers

- Please read the schedule carefully, and display the correct number of stems/blooms.
- Generally, a 'Herbaceous Perennial' flowers every year, has fresh green stems, which die back to
 ground level in the winter. A Shrub grows every year, but has woody stems which don't die back.
- An Annual is a plant that grows from seed for a single year.

- Backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit unless otherwise stated.
- More than one placement may always be included unless otherwise stated.
- In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate.
- Artificial plant material, including artificial fruit is not allowed.
- Natural plant material is either growing fresh, dried or preserved, i.e. flowers and foliage.
- Flowers do not need to have been grown by the exhibitor.
- Take care to ensure display is within the dimensions stated.

- It is really helpful to add a descriptive label.
- We can't control the temperature in the Flower and Produce Tent. Please be aware of this when serving food which has been in the tent for some time. Be particularly wary of using fresh cream for decoration.

Recipe

Class 82: Cinnamon Plait

SERVES 6-8

HANDS-ON TIME 1 HOUR,

OVEN TIME 30-35 MIN,

PLUS RISING AND PROVING

Could there be anything better than waking up to this cinnamon plait recipe being freshly baked for breakfast?

Ingredients:

quantity bread dough
 80g light brown sugar
 tbsp ground cinnamon
 125g salted butter, well softened
 80g raisins
 Flour for dusting

<u>Method</u>

Make the bread dough as in this recipe to the end of step 4, increasing the amount of caster sugar in step 1 to 1 tbsp.

Roll out the dough into a square about 1cm thick.

1 Combine the light brown sugar, cinnamon and butter in a small bowl.

Set aside about 25g of the mix, then spread the rest evenly over the dough using a spatula or palette knife.

Scatter over the raisins.

Starting with one of the long sides, roll up the dough into a log.

Using a rolling pin, roll the log into a long rectangle about 8-10cm wide. Roll gently – you



don't want the dough to split so the raisins poke out.

2 Using a sharp knife, cut the rectangle lengthways into 3 equal strips, leaving 2cm dough intact at one end so the strips stay together.

Plait the strips along the length, then squeeze the ends together to seal.

3 Brush the reserved cinnamon butter over the top of the plait, then carefully lift onto a floured baking sheet.

Cover loosely with a clean tea towel and leave to prove for 45 minutes or until the dough stays indented when gently pressed with your finger.

Heat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan/gas

4. Bake for 30-35 minutes until puffed and golden (cover with foil if it browns too quickly).

Cool completely on a wire rack, then slice or tear to serve.

5 Try a mixture of ground ginger, allspice or nutmeg instead TIPS of the cinnamon, if you like.

This bread is best on the day it's eaten, but it will keep for a day or so, well wrapped, in a cool place.



How do you make a simple bird box?

You will need:

A plank of wood 15cm x 1.4m long x 1.5-1.8cm thick (ensure the wood is untreated)

Tape measure

Pencil

Saw

Screws or nails

Drill or hammer

Waterproof rubber or plastic sheet

A hole saw

A responsible adult to help with sharp objects and power tools

Step-by-step guide

- 1. Find the right bird-friendly spot for your box
- 2. Make sure you have the right wood
- 3. Measure and cut your wood according to the diagram
- 4. Nail all the pieces, except the roof, together
- 5. Attach the roof
- 6. Decorate your box
- 7. Put your box up.






