



## Flower & Produce Show Rules

- 1. The Judges decision shall be final.
- 2. Only one named exhibitor per entry.
- 3. One entry only per person per class.
- 4. All classes are open to all but Special Awards are restricted to the residents within the parishes of Wanborough, Hinton Parva, Liddington and Bishopstone, (with the exception of a special award for the highest points for a non-resident).
- 5. The Exhibitor must have grown the produce, with the exception of the Floral Art classes.
- 6. Entries will close at 22.00 on Thursday 15th August 2024.
  No entries will be taken after that time
- 7. All exhibits to be staged between 8:30 and 10:30 on show day, after which time the marquee will be closed for judging until 14:00.
- 8. Entries into Flower and Produce tent will be FREE this year.
- 9. The Show Society shall not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits, vases or containers.
- 10. Any protest should be made to the Flower and Produce Secretary before 14:30.
- 11. No Prize Money.

Unless otherwise stated in the schedule, the rules contained in the Horticultural Show Handbook 2016 shall apply.

Presentation of Main Awards will be in the Horticultural Tent, around 16:00

Please would prize winners be available at this time. After 16:30 exhibits may be removed.

Exhibits remaining at 17:00 will be auctioned in the Beer Tent. The Committee extends its grateful thanks to those exhibitors who leave their produce for the auction.

## 3 Easy Steps On How To Enter

#### 1. Plan

Study the programme schedule of classes and decide which classes you would like to enter.

Complete the Entry Form on page 23.

#### 2. Enter

Send, drop off, or email the entry form to the addresses on the form before the closing time on 15th August.

Don't forget that you don't have to be an adult to enter the Flower and Produce Show but you do need to use the Flower and Produce Entry Form.

## 3. Stage

Bring along your exhibit(s) to the marguee between 8:30 and 10:30 on Show Day allowing yourself time to stage your produce or exhibit(s).

On arrival at the marquee register your name with the 'Meet and Greet' Team who will give you your entry no. to display on your exhibit(s).

Stewards will be on hand to help and give advice if needed.

Return later, after judging is completed, to enjoy the Show and see whether you have a prize card beside your exhibit(s).

Please collect your exhibits by 16:45, as produce remaining is then entered into the Produce Auction in the Bar.

#### Hints and Tips for Vegetable showing

- Harvest your entries as close to show day as possible for maximum freshness, except for garlic, onions
  or shallots; alliums need time for the skins to dry. Cucumbers do gain extra points if the flower is still
  attached.
- There's lots of advice online about 'staging', or presenting your vegetables, but don't forget that we
  use the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook. Check with Sue Ripley if you don't have a copy.

#### Hints and Tips from the judge for showing Flowers

- Please read the schedule carefully, and display the correct number of stems/blooms.
- Generally, a 'Herbaceous Perennial' flowers every year, has fresh green stems, which die back to ground level in the winter. A Shrub grows every year, but has woody stems which don't die back.
- An Annual is a plant that grows from seed for a single year.

#### Hints and Tips from the floral art judge

- An 'exhibit' is composed of natural plant material with or without accessories, contained within a space as specified in the show schedule.
- Backgrounds, bases, containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics may always be included in an exhibit unless otherwise stated.
- More than one placement may always be included unless otherwise stated.
- In all exhibits natural plant material must predominate.
- Artificial plant material, including artificial fruit is not allowed.
- Natural plant material is either growing fresh, dried or preserved, i.e. flowers and foliage.
- Flowers do not need to have been grown by the exhibitor.
- Take care to ensure display is within the dimensions stated.

#### Hints and Tips from the cookery judges

- Flavour, presentation, consistency and texture are the criteria used for judging.
- It is really helpful to add a descriptive label.
- We can't control the temperature in the Flower and Produce Tent. Please be aware of this when serving food which has been in the tent for some time. Be particularly wary of using fresh cream for decoration.



## Recipe

## **Class 82: Cinnamon Plait**

#### Ingredients:

1 quantity bread dough (see notes)80g light brown sugar1 tbsp ground cinnamon125g salted butter, well softened80g raisinsFlour for dusting

#### Method

- 1) Make bread dough as in notes roll out into a square about 1cm thick. Heat oven to 180'C/160'FAN/Gas 4
- 2) Combine sugar, cinnamon and butter in a small bowl, set aside about 25g of the mix, then spread the rest evenly over the dough, using a spatula or palette knife, scatter over the raisins. Starting with one of the long sides, roll up the dough into a log. Using a rolling pin, roll the log into a long rectangle about 8-10cm wide, roll gently you don't want the dough to split, so the raisins poke out.
- **3)** Using a sharp knife, cut the rectangle lengthways into 3 equal strips, leaving 2cm of dough intact at one end, so the strips stay together. Plait the strips along the length, then squeeze the ends together to seal.
- **4)** Brush the reserved cinnamon butter over the top of the plait, then carefully lift onto a floured baking sheet, cover loosely with a clean tea towel, and leave to prove for 45 mins, or until the dough stays indented when gently pressed with your finger.
- **5)** Bake for 30/35 mins until puffed and golden (cover with foil if it browns too quickly). Cool completely on a wire rack



## Notes - Bread Dough Ingredients:

7g Dried Yeast

1 tbsp Caster sugar

290ml Lukewarm milk

450g Strong Bread Flour plus extra for dusting 1tsp salt

1 Egg

Oil for greasing.

#### Method

- **1)** Dissolve the yeast and sugar in a little of the lukewarm milk, in a small bowl
- 2) Put the flour in a large mixing bowl with the salt. Pour in the yeast mixture, the rest of the milk plus the beaten egg. Stir with a round bladed knife until the dough begins to come together. Tip out onto a lightly floured work surface and knead for 10 minutes, or until the dough becomes smooth and elastic, and springs back when pressed lightly with your finger.
- **3)** Put the dough into a lightly oiled bowl, cover with lightly oiled cling film and leave somewhere warm to rise for 1 hour
- **4)** Tip the dough out onto a lightly floured work surface ad knock back for a minute or two {gently knead to distribute the air.



## How do you make a simple bird box?

#### You will need:

A plank of wood  $15 \text{cm} \times 1.4 \text{m} \log \times 1.5 - 1.8 \text{cm}$  thick (ensure the wood is untreated)

Tape measure

Pencil

Saw

Screws or nails

Drill or hammer

Waterproof rubber or plastic sheet

A hole saw

A responsible adult to help with sharp objects and power tools

#### Step-by-step guide

- Find the right bird-friendly spot for your box
- 2. Make sure you have the right wood
- 3. Measure and cut your wood according to the diagram
- 4. Nail all the pieces, except the roof, together
- 5. Attach the roof
- 6. Decorate your box
- 7. Put your box up.






